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

Panel on Trends Transforming the Legal Profession



This session is designed to be interactive, engaging, and directly shaped by participants' input. Once your attendance at the conference is confirmed, we'll reach out with a few short questions to help you prepare and to enrich our discussion. Your insights will play a key role in making the conversation practical, relevant, and truly collaborative.

Part 1: AI in Legal Practice: Threat, Tool, and Transformation

This session will explore in a practical and highly interactive way, how AI is transforming private practice—emerging simultaneously as a competitive threat and a powerful complement. Through real examples and discussion, the session will examine how advanced AI tools are reshaping legal work, from contract analysis and negotiation strategy to client engagement. It will also address the uniquely human strengths lawyers must cultivate to maintain their distinctive value: accountability, interpretation, and meaningful client interaction. In preparation for the first part of the session, participants are invited to ask a few key clients how they currently use AI in their legal and contractual activities and what they expect from their lawyers in this new context (for example: which tools they use, for which tasks, and how this changes their expectations on responsiveness, pricing and strategic input).

Part 2: New Markets, New Risks: Legal Strategies for a Changing World

Against a backdrop of accelerating market diversification, this session will analyze how expanding into new markets creates both significant opportunities and heightened legal risk. Participants will be invited to share brief five-minute interventions highlighting the key risks foreign investors typically face in their markets and the ways their firms help clients manage or mitigate them. These contributions will enrich a dynamic round-table discussion on how lawyers can anticipate and address cross-border challenges through thoughtful structuring, contractual mechanisms, governance, compliance, and trusted local partnerships.

Spotlight Sessions: Your Ideas, Amplified

Throughout the day, participants will have the opportunity to visit a dedicated breakout room to record short reflections on their presentations and insights about market diversification. These brief interviews will capture key ideas and experiences in a conversational format and may later be repurposed as podcast snippets or promotional content. Participants will also be free to share these recordings on their own firm or professional pages, offering a valuable opportunity to highlight their expertise and extend the reach of their contribution beyond the conference.

Strategic Cohesion and Alignment Workshop

Meet Francois Héon



François Héon is an organisational consultant and leadership expert who has spent more than three decades developing leaders and teams across Canada, Europe, Africa, and beyond. With a background in industrial/organizational psychology and organisational behavior, he completed doctoral studies at the University of Twente, where he examined the impact of the Yin and Yang Leadership Model he created for individual and collective leadership development. Building on extensive international consulting experience, he has developed a distinctive framework that integrates Appreciative (yin) and Intentional (yang) leadership attitudes to support democratic, shared, and collective leadership in organisations.

At the crossroads of management, psychology, and philosophy, François has translated his research and practice into accessible thought leadership on how people and systems change. He regularly designs and facilitates leadership programs for executives and teams, and collaborates with international networks such as the Cooperrider Center for Appreciative Inquiry and France's APM CEO network, where he helps leaders strengthen collaborative, integrative approaches to change. Drawing on this blend of academic rigor and real-world practice, his contribution to the World Link for Law annual conference will focus on how lawyers and law firm leaders can cultivate shared meaning, co-responsibility, and collective leadership in a rapidly changing global environment.

STRATEGIC COHESION AND ALIGNMENT WORKSHOP

This workshop offers World Link for Law members a chance to step back from day-to-day pressures and rethink leadership together. Drawing on François Héon's yin–yang approach and his international experience, it will explore how shared, democratic leadership can strengthen both individual firms and the network as a whole. In a highly interactive format, participants will focus on what they value most in their collaboration and define a small set of concrete, collective priorities—using practical conversations and simple tools that can be applied immediately to foster alignment, co-responsibility, and collective intelligence across borders.

Day 5 - Sunday 10 May Explore Montreal like a local

Step off the beaten path and discover Montréal through the eyes of those who know it best. From art galleries and cozy cafés to culinary gems and cultural landmarks, join the Affilia team for guided walking tours through the city's most vibrant neighborhoods. USEFUL INFORMATION FOR YOUR VISIT TO MONTRÉAL



Arrival: Montréal-Trudeau International Airport (YUL)

- Location: Approx. 19 km (12 miles) from Downtown/Old Montréal.
- Taxi/Ride-Share: ~20–30 minutes. Fixed taxi rate is approx. \$50–\$60 CAD.
- 747 Express Bus: ~30–40 minutes. \$11 CAD (includes 24-hr transit pass). Most economical option.



Weather in May: Spring

- Average High: 19 Degrees Celsius (66 Degrees Fahrenheit)
- Average Low: 9 Degrees Celsius (48 Degrees Fahrenheit)
- Conditions: Expect mild days, and evenings are cool. Layering is essential. A light jacket and umbrella are highly recommended.



Getting Around: Transport Tips

- Walkability: Downtown and Old Montréal are highly walkable.
- The Metro (Subway): Clean, fast, and efficient. Nearest station to W Hotel is Square-Victoria–OACI.
- Fares: Single trip is \$3.75 CAD. A 3-day pass for unlimited use is available (\$21.25 CAD).
- The Underground City (RÉSO): Provides pedestrian access to the W Hotel and downtown areas, convenient for any weather.



Currency & Tipping

- Currency: The official currency is the Canadian Dollar (CAD).
- Payment: Credit cards (Visa, MC, Amex) and contactless payments are accepted everywhere.
- Tipping: Customary at 15% to 20% of the pre-tax bill for restaurants and bars.

TRAVEL TIPS!



Driving & Getting Around

- NO Right Turns on Red: It is strictly illegal to turn right on a red light anywhere on the Island of Montréal. Outside of the island, it's usually allowed, but on the island, it's a quick way to get a ticket. [See the Official Road Rules](#)
- Metro Etiquette: On escalators, the locals' unwritten rule is: Stand on the right, walk on the left. Also, wait for people to exit the Metro car before you step in - it keeps the "flow" moving! [Guide to Driving & Transit in MTL](#)



Cannabis & Smoking Laws

- Strict Age Limits: The legal age for cannabis in Québec is 21 (higher than the 18+ drinking age).
- Public Bans: You cannot smoke or vape cannabis in any public place (sidewalks, parks, or terraces). It is also illegal to smoke tobacco within 9 metres of any door or window of a public building. [See the official Québec Cannabis Regulations](#) | [Learn about the Tobacco Control Act.](#)



Alcohol in Public

- The "Picnic Rule": Drinking in a park is only allowed if you are at a picnic table and consuming a meal. Opening a beer on a park bench without food can lead to a fine.
- Store Hours: You can buy beer and wine at the Dépanneur (convenience store) until 11:00 PM, but spirits are only sold at government SAQ stores. [Read the laws on Public Drinking.](#)



Language & Culture

- The "Bonjour-Hi" Greeting: You'll hear this everywhere! It's the city's way of saying they are ready to help you in both French and English.
- Taxes & Tipping: The price on the tag isn't the final price - expect about 15% tax to be added at the register. For service, a 15–20% tip is the standard for restaurants, bars, and taxis. [Find out more about the tipping guide for Canada](#)

- National Patriots' Day: For those who are extending their stay, note that Monday, May 18th (2026) is a public holiday in Québec. Many locals will be out celebrating, but note that some banks and offices will be closed. [Learn more about this Holiday](#)

Notre-Dame Basilica:

This place is famous for its stunning blue interior. A beautiful sight. Fun Fact: The world-famous singer Celine Dion was married here! [Find out more](#) about this venue.



Mount Royal Park

This "mountain" was designed by Frederick Law Olmsted, the same man who designed New York's Central Park. [Learn more about the park](#)



The Old Port

Saint Joseph's Oratory

Located in the Old Port, this is the tallest observation wheel in Canada. And here's a fun fact for you! The cabins are climate-controlled, so you get a perfect view regardless of the May weather. [Take a ride!](#)



The Biosphere (The Big Dome):

You'll spot this huge metal sphere on the skyline! Did you know... It was the United States pavilion for Expo 67 and is now a museum dedicated to the environment. [Explore the dome.](#)



The Underground City (RESO):

Famous for being a massive 33km network of tunnels and shops - this place is used by over 500,000 people every day to navigate the city centre! [Explore the network.](#)



Marché Bonsecours:

This historic building with the shiny silver dome is a Montréal icon. It once served as the Parliament of United Canada for a brief time in the 1840s. [Check out the boutiques](#)



Olympic Stadium & the Inclined Tower:

Did you know that this is the tallest inclined tower in the world, leaning at a 45-degree angle? You can take a glass elevator to the top for a 360-degree view. [Step inside](#) and be amazed!

Famous for its ski-resort vibe - and whilst the snow is gone by May, the mountains come alive with spring colours. It's famous for its vibrant pedestrian village, championship golf courses, and the scenic gondola ride to the highest peak in the Laurentians. [Find out more!](#)

Saint-Sauveur:

Taking a scenic 3-hour train ride or 2.5-hour drive along the St. Lawrence River, will bring you to this UNESCO World Heritage treasure.

As the only fortified city north of Mexico, it offers 400 years of history and a romantic atmosphere that feels like a trip to France.

Our Featured Hotel: Fairmont Le Château Frontenac

Sitting high on the cliffs, this is famously the most photographed hotel in the world. It isn't just a place to stay - it is a national landmark that defines the Quebec City skyline. A must-see, if you can!

This hotel has been host to royalty and world leaders, this was the site of the secret Quebec Conferences in 1943, where Winston Churchill and Franklin D. Roosevelt met to strategize the end of WWII.

Following a \$75 million renovation, the hotel perfectly blends its majestic past with modern luxury. Enjoy a cocktail at the 1608 Bar (named for the city's founding year) or stroll the Terrasse Dufferin right outside the front door for breathtaking river views.

WHAT ELSE IS THERE TO DO?

Quartier Petit Champlain

Accessible by the "Breakneck Stairs" or a charming funicular, this is one of the most picturesque districts in North America. [Explore the area](#)

Montmorency Falls

Located just 15 minutes from the hotel, these falls are actually 30 meters taller than Niagara Falls!

You can walk across a suspension bridge directly over the crest of the falls for a heart-pounding view or take the cable car for a panoramic look at the St. Lawrence River. [See the Falls.](#)



CHASING WATERFALLS!

Québec is home to several hidden waterfall gems... whilst you're here, why not visit one of these spectacular sites? Whether you are looking for the roar of a world-famous wonder or a peaceful escape into the forest, there's something for everyone.




Niagara Falls:

Just a 1.5-hour flight or a scenic 9-hour rail journey from Montréal. If you are already in Toronto, it's a quick 2-hour shuttle or train ride. Here you can witness the sheer power of the world's most famous waterfall. For the full experience, hop on the "Maid of the Mist" boat tour to feel the spray or take the "Journey Behind the Falls" to stand in the tunnels directly behind the thundering wall of water. Dorwin Falls (Rawdon):

A simple 1-hour drive north of Montréal you'll find the [Dorwin Falls](#) - these magnificent 60-foot-high falls are tucked away in a lush park of century-old pines. It is the perfect spot for a peaceful nature walk. Keep an eye out for the rock formation that looks like a face - local legend says it's a sorcerer turned to stone!



Plaisance Falls:

Located 1.5 hours from Montréal, near Montebello, the [Plaisance Falls](#) offer a massive 63-metre drop, and are majestic.
